General Education Transfer Guide Washtenaw Community College

This guide lists WCC courses that meet requirements in EMU's <u>general education</u> <u>program</u>. Students who transfer with the <u>Michigan Transfer Agreement</u> (MTA)[‡] will have satisfied Effective Communication, Quantitative Reasoning, and Knowledge of the Disciplines and only need to complete the Perspectives on a Diverse World, Learning Beyond the Classroom, and Writing Intensive requirements (see the <u>General Education Transfer Guidelines</u>.) A grade of <u>C/2.0 is required</u> for transfer credit.

Learning Beyond the Classroom (GELB)
☐ If admitted to EMU as a transfer student complete <u>1 option</u> from one of six groups.
This requirement must be completed at EMU.
Writing Intensive (GEWI) – 1 course
☐ Complete one approved course determined by your <u>major</u> .
This requirement must be completed at EMU.

[‡] The Michigan Transfer Agreement satisfies specific general education requirements, but does not exempt prerequisite, program, or degree requirements.

[#] Students are encouraged to select courses that satisfy both general education and program requirements where possible. An advisor can assist in identifying appropriate options.
